Change this family's future

Greetings! **My name is Emmanuel George and I have worked at the brickyard kiln from my childhood.**

I don't know how many of my ancestors died while working here. I saw my father and grandfather working here, making bricks and baking bricks. My mother and siblings also work with me. We have seen great misery and poverty.

Three thousand bricks have to be made every day for small wages. It is not enough to live.

Sister Aneela has been bringing us the Word of God for three years and sharing the love of Christ with us. She taught us that Jesus wants to set us free. We are thankful to God for this great consolation. We are also thankful to you for remembering us from so far away and praying, fasting, and feeding us every month.

I am asthmatic. I have borrowed money from the kiln owners due to my illness. I pray I can pay it off. I want to be free from the bondage of this life of slavery. The reason I can't work is because of the dust from the mud. The doctor said because of the dust from the mud I will get frequent asthma attacks.

My wife is also sick. She has a disease of her reproductive organs. Because of this the doctor forbade her to sit on floor. But the kiln owners force us to work and cut our wages when we can't work. They demand money from us. **They also want us to change our religion** and threaten that if we don't, they can treat us very bad.

I have only one daughter.

Please continue to pray for us. May our God have pity on us and set us free. We will die but we will not back down from our faith. They prevent us from worshipping in our homes. They also forbid sister Aneela from visiting us. But because of yours and her prayers and our good behavior, the brickyard owner allowed her to visit us.

My debt is about \$896. If my family can be released, I can work in any factory. I will rent a house. It will be great blessing for me. **We would need to pay the first 2 months' rent for my house.**

Thank you. May God have mercy on us and may God bless you. Amen!
