Greetings to all the brothers and sisters in Christ.

My name is Nadeem Masih, and I am the laborer of Clarkabad brickyard. About 22 months ago, **I lost my job** due to Covid 19. Offices, factories, schools were closed due to the Covid 19. People began to starve. Unemployment has risen sharply in the country. As a result, many Christian workers were fired.

I used to work as a street sweeper, but I also lost my job, simply because I am a Christian. I have worked hard to find another job, but I couldn't find one.

My landlord kicked me out of the house because **I could not pay the rent**. I didn't even have food to feed my children. We probably spent a whole week on the road. Eventually I started begging on the road for food. While begging on the road, **I had an accident** with a car and my leg was broken.

My wife went to the owner of a nearby brickyard and borrowed money for my treatment and food for the children. So we were forced to live in the mud house at the brickyard.

I was admitted to the hospital for treatment and during this time my wife worked on the brickyard kiln to feed the children. When I recovered, I wanted to help my wife, but my legs were not able to sit and make bricks... My wife could not work in the kiln alone. The owner of the kiln also did not treat the Christian workers well. They despise us.

Now my wife and my children work here together but **we don't get full pay from the kiln owners because I can't make bricks**. Being a large family, we can't make enough to live. I want to be free from the bondage of the brickyard. **I must pay off my debt of \$1138**. We can go live with my brother.

Please help me and my family to be released to freedom. We will be able to worship our Lord freely. Please help me.
