Parvez has been in this brickyard since he was very young. **His father died of hepatitis C and lungs issues.** No one was there to take care of the family after the father died. Parvez, his mother and one sister all work together at the brickyard.

They receive no money compensation because they were forced to borrow from the brickyard owner. **They have worked years for just basic food.** They are never able to pay off their debt.

During Covid season, **they had to borrow money for an operation for his sister-in-law.** That additionally they can never pay back. They must make 2000 bricks a day. **There are seven people total in the family.**

Parvez desperately wants to get his family out of the brickyard and slavery. He does not want to die there.

He and his son have connections to work in a factory if they get out. They have a place to live if they can get out. The family can also sell fruit on the streets if they can get a cart.

Please help IAGM to free them from the brickyard. It would be the greatest joy to worship and praise God freely and live a normal life. They struggle every day to stay alive.
